## From our Principal

Term 1, 2020 is certainly going to be a term to remember... thanks to the Coronavirus outbreak! We have seen events postponed or cancelled, supermarket shelves emptied, toilet paper rolls missing in action and hand sanitiser, now our best friend! All the while, our students, staff and families have taken it all in their stride. Hygiene has been our number one message throughout the school and our kids have responded to this responsibly and diligently

Of course, we have all been inundated with COVID-19 news by the media - what seems like every minute of the day, all containing an abundance of information and predictions. Quite simply, our school's directions come from DET (Department of Education and Training). The school receives daily updates of the latest bans and actions and we will continue to keep you all updated as new information comes to hand. The advice of the Chief Health Officer remains at present that our schools should stay open, except in the case of a confirmed case of COVID-19 (coronavirus disease).

#### The school must be notified if a student or staff member is:

- a person who has a confirmed case of COVID-19
- a person who has had close contact with a confirmed case of COVID-19 in the past 14 days.

The school will initially close for 24hrs after the notification to ensure a 'deep clean' of the school and further assessment of the situation.

I am aware some parents have made the decision to keep their child/children at home as a precautionary measure and I completely understand this course of action. If this is what you intend to do please be sure to notify the office, so appropriate arrangements can be made regarding the provision of work. Likewise, if you child is unwell, it is important to keep them at home until the symptoms of their illness have passed. Should you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact the office.

Hopefully you have all received a letter this week (sent home yesterday with the eldest of the family) requesting an update of your contact details. Accurate details are vital, especially if we do need to contact you promptly. Please return these forms to the office as soon as possible.

We also have some staff changes starting term 2. It will be great to have our Principal, Lyn Strachan return after being on carer's leave this term. I would like to thank Ben Holmfield for stepping up into the Acting Assistant Principal role for the last 4 weeks of this term. He has done a great job reinforcing the power of our school values. Jodie Maiden will be taking unexpected leave as of the end of this term and will not be returning this year. We wish Jodie all the best during her time away. Deena Pridham will be replacing Jodie for the remainder of the year. Of course, Deena has extensive experience teaching in Level 3, but will be missed in Level 2. We are currently advertising for a teacher, 2 days a week to replace Deena in level 2. We aim to have this position filled during the first week of the holidays. Stay tuned!

As this is our last newsletter for the term, I thank you all for your ongoing support while in the Acting Principal role this term and wish you all a safe and healthy term break. Recharge and see you all back here for term 2!

# **COVID-19 Update**

Information is being communicated from DET to schools daily and is constantly changing. This is the most current information available at this time.

**Cleaning** DET has arranged for the provision of additional cleaning for the remainder of the term. We met with our cleaning contractor this morning, and beginning today, our cleaners are now coming through the school during the lunch break to disinfect and clean high touch areas and toilets. Our daily clean has been pushed back to commence at 5.00pm (previously 2.30pm) to avoid cross contamination. Hand wash has also been provided to each classroom.

**Water** As of today we have disconnected the bubble taps as a further recommended hygiene measure. Students can fill their drink bottles from the taps in their classrooms. We have purchased bottled water for each double class space to cater for those students who have not brought their drink bottle to school. These will be named and students encouraged to reuse. We strongly encourage students to bring their own drink bottle to school.

**Social Distancing** One of the recommendations from health authorities is that people should endeavour to keep a distance of 1.5 metres between themselves and others. This can be implemented by staff in schools, however it is not always practical for this advice to be applied to interactions with students, especially young students.

From today students lining up outside at the end of breaks are positioned 1.5m apart. We had a practice run this morning and the kids then did an awesome job at the end of the lunch break.

Classrooms have been rearranged to increase the space between tables, grouped tables have been broken up and floor time is being discouraged. Our classrooms certainly look very different and our staff are doing an amazing job of adapting their teaching style at very short notice. We are sure the kids will tell you all about this crazy day for themselves!





#### SAFETY IN AND AROUND SCHOOL

We ask that all parents please remind their children to use the provided crossings, Sutton Street can be a very dangerous place to cross with parked cars and buses moving in and out, children can not be seen until it is too late and we ask that you remind your children to walk to the crossing and use it at all times.

Please note that the Staff Carpark (blue stone) is not be used as a walkway to get to classrooms or be used to park in to drop off or collect students, this area needs to remain free from traffic for staff, emergency services and tradepersons use. We thank-you in advance.
